MEET THE NEW KREMMLING TOWN MANAGER

Water Use & Fire Code Enforcement - The Board discussed water use overages and enforcement of fire code with the Town Manager. The Town Attorney is reportedly preparing an IGA. Jen, the manager, will research both issues and report back to the District. Tucker stressed the importance of keeping hydrants and alleys clear in winter and will coordinate with the Town Works Department. Mathis will get a list of problematic and or outdated hydrants to Jen.

Wildland Resiliency Code - The Wildland Resiliency Code was discussed. Fire districts may be required to enforce the code. Hassler and Tucker will look into the specifics.

Bulk Water Station - Hassler reported that the town is installing a bulk water station. A tee connection is being considered to provide the department with access to water.

Apparatus Update

- SVI still has R-419 and is awaiting a response from a Wyoming department regarding potential purchase. Tucker's asking price remains firm at \$265,000, with no equipment included other than permanently installed components.
- Staff and officers recommend replacing R-419 with a T-3 Engine, which would function as an Urban Interface apparatus, a backup to T-1, and offer increased capability with fewer personnel. The replacement process should begin once the sale of R-419 is confirmed.
- A lease purchase may be required, depending on whether a demo unit is found or a new engine is built.
- C-417 also needs to be outfitted with a Highway Products box to make it response-ready. The cost of the box from Highway Products Inc is \$9,085.01.

A MOTION FOR THE FIRE DISTRICT TO AUTHORIZE THE PURCHASE OF A NEW PICKUP BOX IN THE AMOUNT OF \$9,085.01 FROM CAPITAL RESERVES WAS MADE BY HASSLER. SECONDED BY CARLAND. MOTION CARRIED

Old Business:

- **Gutters**: Installation is complete. A minor additional cost may be needed for sealing due to the lack of roof overhang. Heat tape may be required in winter.
- **Billing**: Tawnya reports the new billing process is working well, with a collection rate over 50% to date. The system is still being fine-tuned.
- **Upstairs Remodel**: The estimate for the upstairs remodel is \$23,254.00.

Wildfire Evacuation Map

- The map is designed to be a single, publicly accessible source for evacuation zones. Each fire district is divided into individual blocks, allowing homeowners to easily check whether their property is included in an evacuation area.
